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California Policy Update

Bay Area Approves Zero-NOx Emissions Standard for Appliances

On March 15th, the Bay Area Air Quality Management District (BAAQMD) approved proposed amendments to Rules <u>9-4</u> and <u>9-6</u>, which set limits on nitrous oxides (NOx) for natural gas-fired appliances, including **residential and commercial furnaces, storage and instantaneous water heaters, boilers, and combination space/water heating boilers**. In addition to new ultra low-NOx requirements, BAAQMD has implemented **zero-NOx standards**, setting a precedent for zero-emissions regulations for appliances. The BAAQMD is one of 35 air districts in California with individual pollution control regulations.

Compliance is based on the date of manufacture, propane gas models are excluded, and mobile home water heaters and pool heaters are not affected.

An implementation Working Group has been established that will periodically report to the Board on technical readiness and equitability. At least two years prior to the compliance date, an interim report will include a technology assessment that details the projected costs of purchase and installation of such technology.
